Though we are open to all proposals, we are less inclined to consider the topic of memorials this year, having dealt with these very recently. We are also seeking proposals for a possible cosponsored session with the [Mormon Studies Consultation](#) on Mormon attitudes and beliefs surrounding death, dying, and the afterlife. Again, any approach is appreciated.
